Aims

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ Established in 1993 as the Stratford City Challenge Community History Project
- ❖ Became a company limited by guarantee and registered charity in 1998
- ❖ East London People's Archive established in 1999 with HLF funding
- ❖ Projects have included:
 - West Ham at War education pack
 - Black Angels from the Empire booklet
 - Aberfeldy Youth Project
 - North Woolwich publication and work with local school
 - "My Roots Our Heritage" video project
 - Somali Stories cd rom produced in collaboration with Manor School
 - Our Brick Lane Video and Education Pack
 - Teenage Parents blog 'Don't Hush Discuss'

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ Worked with over 200 community groups
- ❖ Employed 20 staff
- ❖ 8 local Trustees/Directors
- ❖ Supported 200 volunteers
- ❖ Involved over 15,000 individuals
- ❖ East London Peoples Archive holds over 1700 oral histories and thousands of photographs preserved for public benefit
- ❖ Produced 16 publications, 30 Video documentaries, over 80 exhibitions, education and training resources

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ **Think about your organisation**
- ❖ **Are you ready to make an application?**

Look at the set up of your organisation. Have you got an up-to-date constitution (set of rules) - is it dated and signed as adopted?

- ❖ **Are you registered as a charity?**

This is a requirement for some, but not all, funders.

- ❖ **How many active members do you have?**
- ❖ **Do they need training of any kind?**

Funding Where?

- ❖ Local Authorities
- ❖ Council for Voluntary Service's CVS
- ❖ Big Lottery
- ❖ Awards for All
- ❖ HLF (The Heritage Lottery Fund)
- ❖ Arts Council G4A (ACE)
- ❖ Funder Finder (Funding Central)

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ Be clear about your application
- ❖ It must meet the funder's criteria
- ❖ Some funders prefer potential applicants to contact them to discuss ideas before an application is submitted – if the funder(s) you want to apply to offer this facility take advantage of it. It can save you a lot of time and
- ❖ But do remember to submit any enclosures the funder has requested, such as annual accounts, constitution etc.

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ give a concise description of your organisation, its background, membership and achievements to date
- ❖ demonstrate clearly the needs which you are trying to meet
- ❖ explain why it is important that these needs are met
- ❖ show what your solution is to address these needs
- ❖ demonstrate that your organisation has, or can obtain, the necessary skills and expertise to deal with these needs
- ❖ Use SMART objectives

Use SMART objectives

- ❖ Specific
- ❖ Measurable
- ❖ Attainable
- ❖ Relevant
- ❖ Timely

Eastside Community Heritage



A specific goal will usually answer the five "W" questions:

What: What do I want to accomplish?

Why: Specific reasons, purpose or benefits of accomplishing the goal.

Who: Who is involved?

Where: Identify a location.

Which: Identify requirements and constraints.

A measurable goal will usually answer questions such as:

How much?

How many?

How will I know when it is accomplished

Eastside Community Heritage



A relevant goal can answer yes to these questions:

Does this seem worthwhile?

Is this the right time?

Does this match our other efforts/needs?

Are you the right person?

Is this acceptable for correction?

A time-bound goal will usually answer the question:

When?

What can I do six months from now?

What can I do six weeks from now?

What can I do today

Eastside Community Heritage



- ❖ explain what plans you have to raise the funding you need
- ❖ state how much you hope to raise from each funder
- ❖ explain how you hope to fund the project in future years (if applicable)
- ❖ give a contact number that you can be easily contacted at.
- ❖ ask someone, preferably unconnected with your organisation, to read over your completed application form before you submit it.
